Curriculum

A minimum of twenty-two credits is required for a Cincinnati Central School Diploma. This includes four credits of english, four credits of social studies, three credits of mathematics, three credits of science, two credits in physical education, one credit of art/music, a half credit of health, and a credit in computer applications. Elective courses are offered in the areas of english, social studies, math, science and computers. Full programs of study are offered in art, two foreign languages, music and computers. College credits can be earned in english, math, health, music, and computers through an articulation agreement with Tompkins-Cortland Community College. Cincinnati began offering AP classes and Honor classes in the 2014-2015 school year, AP US History and Global History I Honors. In 2016 - 2017 the district will continue with Global History II Honors, AP US History and AP Government and Politics.

Class Period

Students are in class for 42 minutes a day for 40 weeks (182 days) resulting in one unit of credit. There are nine periods of class time each day.

All numerical courses are included. The Rank Average is weighted and the GPA Average is unweighted. This is indicated on the student transcript. The following courses receive a 1.1 weight: College Writing & Literature, French IV & V, Physics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus I, Calculus II and Spanish IV & V.
