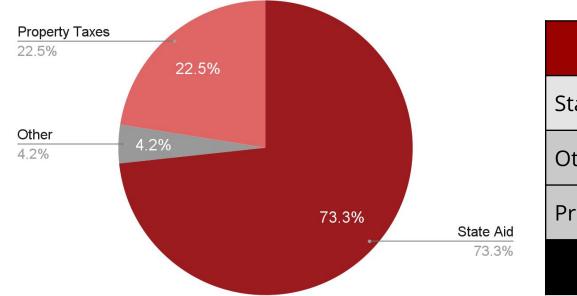

PROPOSITIONS

PROPOSITION 1

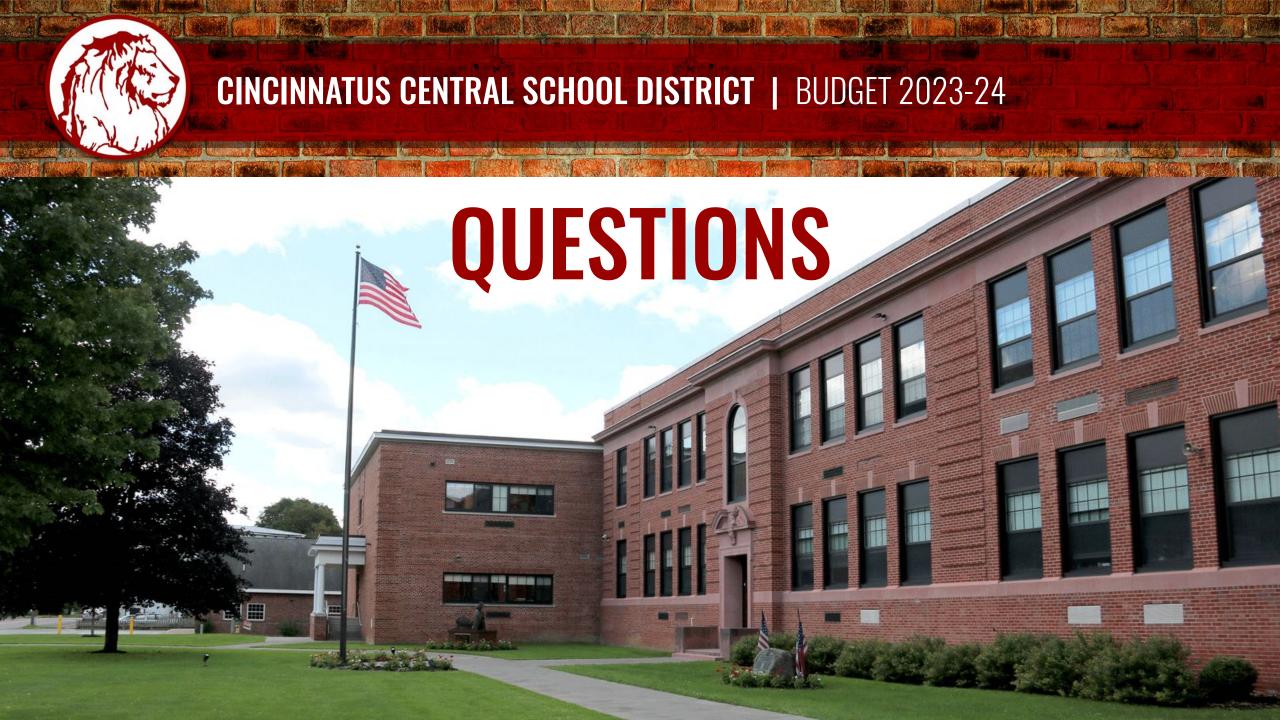
Shall the Board of Education of the Cincinnatus Central School District be authorized to appropriate and expend the amount not to exceed \$17,968,722 for general purposes for the year of 2023-2024 and to levy a tax on the taxable property of the school district as provided by law?

PROPOSITION 2

The Board of Education of the Cincinnatus Central School District, Cortland, Chenango and Broome Counties, New York is hereby authorized to purchase school buses, including incidental equipment and expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost (after-trade-in allowance) of \$458,933 and said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education law, and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued.

BOE VOTE

The election of three (3) members of the Board of Education. Three (3) three-year terms to fill the vacancies caused by the expiration of the terms of Thomas Mulhern III, Margert (Peg) Peri, and Tess Southern.
