Demonstrate proficiency in an elective course that promotes civic engagement
.5 points* (can be earned multiple times)

An elective course that promotes Civic Engagement affords students the opportunity to communicate the ways in which various experiences and activities have impacted their civic knowledge, skills and mindsets.

- Civic Knowledge: demonstrating a fundamental and functional knowledge of government, law, history, geography, culture, economics, and current events.
- Civic Skills: demonstrating a broad array of skills including but not limited to critical thinking, analytic, verbal, communication, media literacy skills.
- Civic Mindset: demonstrating a commitment to democratic interpersonal and intrapersonal values, virtues, attitudes, and beliefs and informed actions that promote and facilitate meaningful participation in civic life.

Students must complete the Elective Course Student Review and Reflection sheet for **each** elective course that fits the description; each completed/approved reflection sheet is worth .5 points. The completed reflection form should be turned into the Seal of Civic Readiness Google Classroom.
