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Prevalence Rates

- 1 in 5 Youth will experience a behavioral health challenge
 - *32% of youth (13–18) have an Anxiety Disorder*
 - 19% of youth (13–18) have a Behavior Disorder
 - 11% of youth (13–18) have a Substance Use Disorder
 - 11% of School-Aged youth have ADHD/ADD
- One Half of all lifetime cases of Mental Illness begin by age 14.
